Family Discussion

Parents, feel free to use these questions as conversation starters. For older kids, encourage them not to just answer the questions, but to really think about what they are answering.

- 1. Why did God flood the earth?
- 2. How did God take care of Noah before the flood?
- 3. What sign did God give to Noah and his family after the flood?
- 4. How did Noah know that it was ok to leave the ark?
- 5. How has God been there for you? How has He taken care of you?
- 6. Extra question just for fun! How do you think all the animals got along being in one BIG boat?


Fun Family Activity


